Message for March 29, the 5th Sunday in Lent.

Grace and peace to you.

Today's scripture reading anticipates Easter. Lazarus is raised from the dead (John 11:1-45). Ezekiel has a vision of a valley of dry bones. God causes them to come alive again: sinews, flesh, skin and, finally, the breath of life. God tells Ezekiel that Israel will rise from its graves, be given the Spirit, and live. In Romans, Paul tells the Church that we are live the new life "in the Spirit."

Good News indeed! And all the more relevant when we live in a season of pandemic. God is good!

God is greater that the corona virus. We are also called to greatness. Our bishop has a stirring message calling us to persevere in faith and love and service at this time.
