Dear friends,

First, a thank you. More of us have been in church this summer than in recent years. The energy level of the congregation is high.


Second, special thanks to Bill Riley for his tremendous, and skilled, work on adding a new section on our Columbarium. It looks like it will be finished before September is over.

I wish I could celebrate the beginning of a new Church School season. We have curriculum and trained teachers standing by to help children learn about God and our church. All we need is children. Could you consider bringing some children to church with you on Sundays? Relatives, children of friends and neighbors, the boy who mows your lawn are all possibilities. You need to get permission from their parents, of course, and persuade them to give us a try. Some kids love the Episcopal Church at first exposure.

Don't stop with children. Consider who you might persuade to visit St. George's for a Sunday Eucharist: a neighbor, a friend, an inactive parishioner, someone who owes you a favor. Just ask them to come and see what is so important in your life, and might be in theirs. You need to invite, to offer rides, or ask for a ride for yourself. Don't forget to mention the great food at our coffee hours. Share why you come to worship God at St. George's Episcopal Church. Perhaps the music, or the preaching, or the people, or the liturgy, or whatever. But you do come, and are generally very glad you do. Your Vestry and I will be working on additional reasons to invite others to activities at the church. Watch for announcements.

One very good reason to come to worship is to pray, both alone and in community. Roseburg needs prayer. So does Oregon. And the good old USA, not to mention Canada and Mexico, and every other country on earth. And we pray for the Earth as well. Prayer has results. Things happen. People get engaged with the opportunities and challenges around us. And God's wonderful love and power are made manifest in ways both small and grand. You and I have found the beauty of worship, the grace of God, and caring friends at St. George's. Other people can as well.


Thank you for blessing me and Pam with your faith, hope, and love.



In Memoriam

Richard Karl 'Barney' Spielman

Dec. 22, 1945 - July 31, 2019



Barney was the brother of St. George parishioner Bob Spielman. He was on our prayer list for many months as he fought cancer.

Barney graduated from Roseburg High School in 1964 and joined the Army, becoming a helicopter mechanic. Throughout his life he worked for several airlines, including 10 years with Goodyear airships and 34 years with Horizon Air. He lived with his wife, Denise, and his stepdaughter, Alaina, in Portland, retiring to Hood River so that he could do volunteer restoring of antique aircraft.

As Bob writes in Barney's Oregonian obituary:

His special calling, though, was being Santa Claus. After "playing" Santa for a niece's party in 1996, he "became" Santa – he had found his calling.

Naturally a kind, generous man with a hearty laugh and infectious, jolly demeanor, his soul was the soul of Santa. He grew a "real" beard, and his laugh truly became the "ho-ho-ho" that everyone recognizes. Barney carried candy canes with him all year long, since everyone recognized Santa, in or out of his red pickup with its SLEIGH license plates. The cameras came out as people saw him and asked to take a selfie, or "elfie" as he called it.

His deepest joy was putting smiles on peoples' faces and performing countless anonymous acts of kindness. He was truly one of a kind and he, his laugh and his candy canes will be greatly missed.



Columbarium

The Columbarium expansion project is proceeding as planned and should be finished in October.

Bill Riley reported:

On August 20, Mari-Jo Miles helped pour two cubic yards of pre-mixed concrete in the trench. In the photo below she is tapping a form to bring the small aggregate to the edge, making it smooth. The picture on the top right shows the trench with rebar after the County Inspector approved construction. The picture at bottom right was taken August 23 after the forms had been removed and the ground cleaned up a bit.

On August 28 our son Michael and I plan to pick up the new prefabricated Columbarium in Pittsburgh, PA and will drive to Bend, OR, where on September 3 we will load up 350 bricks, delivering all to St. George that day. On or about September 4 we plan to start working with Randall Dukart of Duke's Masonry, Winston, to install the new Columbarium.





When finished, there will be 64 additional spaces along the west-facing wall. You are invited to purchase your own niche for \$550. It is not necessary to be a member of St. George's to buy one.
