R.S. Thomas, a renowned Welsh poet, once said in a radio interview that in his poetry that he was trying to find out what it means to use the word God in the late 20th century. This beautiful poem is an example of his work.

Thomas, an Anglican Priest who wandered over the moors immersed in tranquility, makes a direct comparison here between church and nature.
