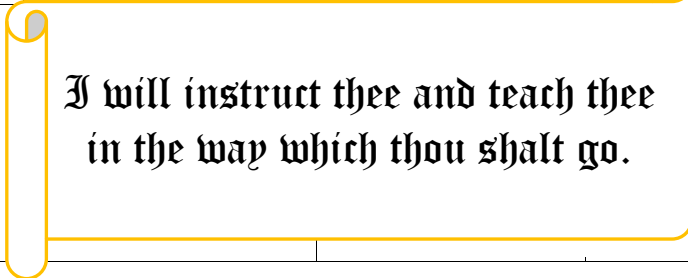

Sermons

In the drugstore, where the young woman seemed frustrated that her register was acting up, I said not to worry I was in no rush at all.

On the sidewalk, I saw some litter which I picked up and tossed into a recycle container.

In my yard, I listened to my elderly neighbor tell me about her trip to see her grandchildren.

All three moments were “sermons” because they each demonstrated what I believe in a spiritual way. In two of these messages, I said a few words and in one I was silent, but they each embodied a witness to faith.

Being aware that life is a sermon keeps us mindful of what we are preaching, even if we never say a word.
